England Athletics have opened a consultation to change Young Athletes Age Groups from U11, U13, U15, U17, U20 to U12, U14, U16, U18 and U20 from April 2025 so will not impact ager groups for next season. This will have a major impact on all young athletes going forward. The main motivation is to try and retain more young athletes in the sport, bring the UK more inline with other countries and result in athletes being under less pressure from exams when at the top of their age group.
